Global Perspectives

Today in assembly we recognised our Year 11 boys who excelled in the Cambridge International Examinations AS Level, Global Perspectives. Students in our two Year 10 Accelerate Classes have taken this course of study for the last three years and today we acknowledged those who had achieved excellence, gaining an A+ or A Grade in 2016. These boys also study NCEA Level 1 Mathematics and Science, and some also study Economics. Cambridge International AS Level

Global Perspectives syllabus prepares learners for positive engagement with our rapidly changing world. Learners broaden their outlook through the critical analysis of - and reflection on issues of global significance. The Cambridge International AS Level Global Perspectives syllabus is based on skills rather than on specific content. Learners develop research, thinking, reasoning and communication skills by following an approach analysing and evaluating arguments.

The skills gained through study of CIE AS Level Global Perspectives help enable student to meet requirements for Excellence endorsement in NCEA in their future studies, meet the demands of 21st Century learning and make a successful transition to study in higher education. Over the cohort of 58 boys, they achieved very pleasing results with 86% gaining a C Grade or better compared with 82% in 2015.





The Tauranga Boys' College Senior A Tennis Team travelled to New Plymouth to compete in the annual Super 8 Tournament. Day one provided a solid start to the tournament with a comfortable 6 nil win over invitation team, Francis Douglas College. The second day was much closer with strong singles play providing the pathway for a 5 - 1 win over a very strong Hamilton Boys' High School team. This resulted in Tauranga Boys' finishing top of their pool. The semi-final saw Tauranga meet an in form Napier Boys' High School team. All 4 singles players had superb matches, going out to an unbeatable 4 nil lead. As a result the doubles were not required. The tie doubled as a qualifying match for the New Zealand Secondary School Champs in late March. The final against Palmerston North Boys' High was particularly intense as always. Potts and Crowther led the charge with resounding straight sets victories at 1 and 2 respectively while Loomb picked up a hard-fought and vital three set win at 3. The doubles combinations of Potts/Crowther and Darling/Currie completed the job for an outstanding 5 - 1 result. Congratulations to all five players for three superb days of tennis and for bringing home the coveted Super 8 shield.
