Please note that as previously advised, reports will be sent out electronically and available through the parent portal on the College website. The reports will not be sent by mail as has occurred previously.




An enjoyable and entertaining evening was hosted by Tauranga Boys' College Arts Council on Friday evening 12th May at the Tauranga Art Gallery.
