CRICKET

The 2016/17 season was highlighted by two two fantastic achievements.

For the first time TBC entered our 3rd XI side in the WBOP 'B' Grade competition. The 3rd XI was made up of predominantly Year 10 2016 students moving into Year 11 this year. Player/coaches Grant Manners (Term 4 2016) and Shaun Fisher (Term 1 2017) rallied the boys together well throughout the season in a grade where none of the boys had played against adults previously.

TBC made their way through to the final where they decimated Singh XI by rolling them for 84 and knocking off the total with 6 wickets in hand.

Our NZCT side faltered at the very last hurdle in losing to Hamilton Boys' High School. Had we won that fixture we would have had another side in the National Tournament.

The other superb achievement came in the form of our Cooney Lees Morgan TBC 1st XI who qualified for the National Secondary Schools 1st XI Cup to be held in December this year by winning the week long Northern Districts 1st XI Cup held in Hamilton. For those of you that are unaware, the National tournament is made up of only 6 teams (one side from each major association).

On Monday we bowled Whangarei BHS out for 46. Rhys Mischewski stole the show with 6/12. The runs were easily knocked off inside 12 overs.

Here we played Tikipunga, Rangitoto and Gisborne and won all 3 games to move into the business end of the tournament, Quarter Finals.

At 8am on Thursday morning we came up against Waimea in a do or die match. The quarter finals have proved to be a very difficult match for TBC over the last couple years where we have been knocked out. However, this year we weren't going to let that happen! The boys got up and were able to bring the noise to a very quiet gym winning the game 3-0. Time to focus as we now faced a very loud and extremely talented Manurewa team in the Semifinals later that night.
