



Tim Conder was a student at Tauranga Boys' College from 2004 until 2008 and was dux and deputy head boy in his final year at school.

Tim went on to at the University of Auckland, and graduated in 2014 with a Bachelor of Laws with Honours, a Bachelor of Science (majoring in Maths and Physics) and a Diploma in Languages (Majoring in Attic Greek). While at University, Tim represented Auckland in Mooting and Witness Examination competitions, winning the national championship and ranking in the top 10 competitors in Australia.

After graduation, Tim worked for the High Court in Auckland for two years as a Judges' Clerk, assisting Judges with research on judgments. In early 2016, Tim returned to Tauranga, joining the litigation team at Holland Beckett and began appearing in the District Court, Employment Court and High Court.

Tim has since undertaken major cases in the areas of trust and estates, commercial and criminal law. He has also completed his masters degree in Law while working and has published academic articles in a number of national journals including the New Zealand Law Review.

In 2016, Tim was also invited to join the Law Commission's expert advisory group for its declaratory judgments review, following on from work he had done in this area.
