



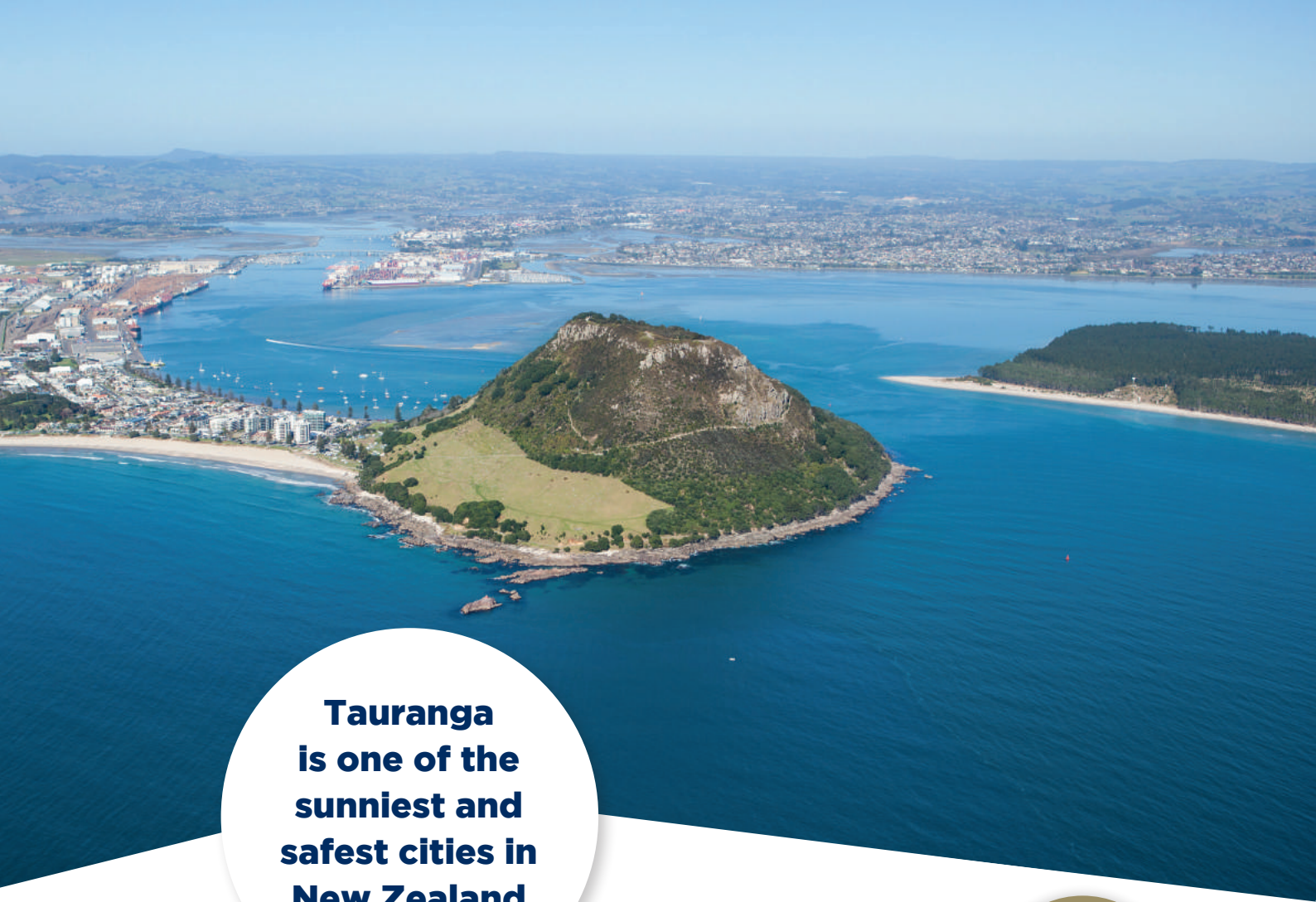

Camps Offered

There are many camps and trips that take place in the Outdoor Education department each year (see below). These camps are designed to maximise student-learning outcomes in an Outdoor setting and have the highest levels of safety management in place.

International students are an integral part of Tauranga Boys' College and the Outdoor Education programme. Usually international students just attend the camps/trips that relate to their current course, usually 12, 13. At times however we find these students wish to be involved in the other ODE or PE camps/trips.

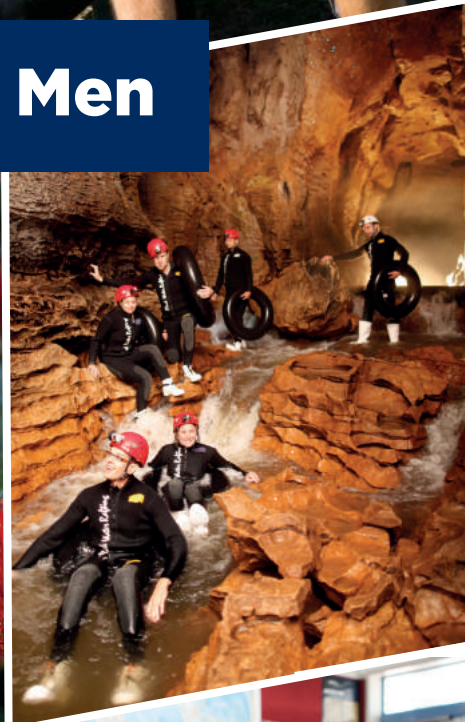
