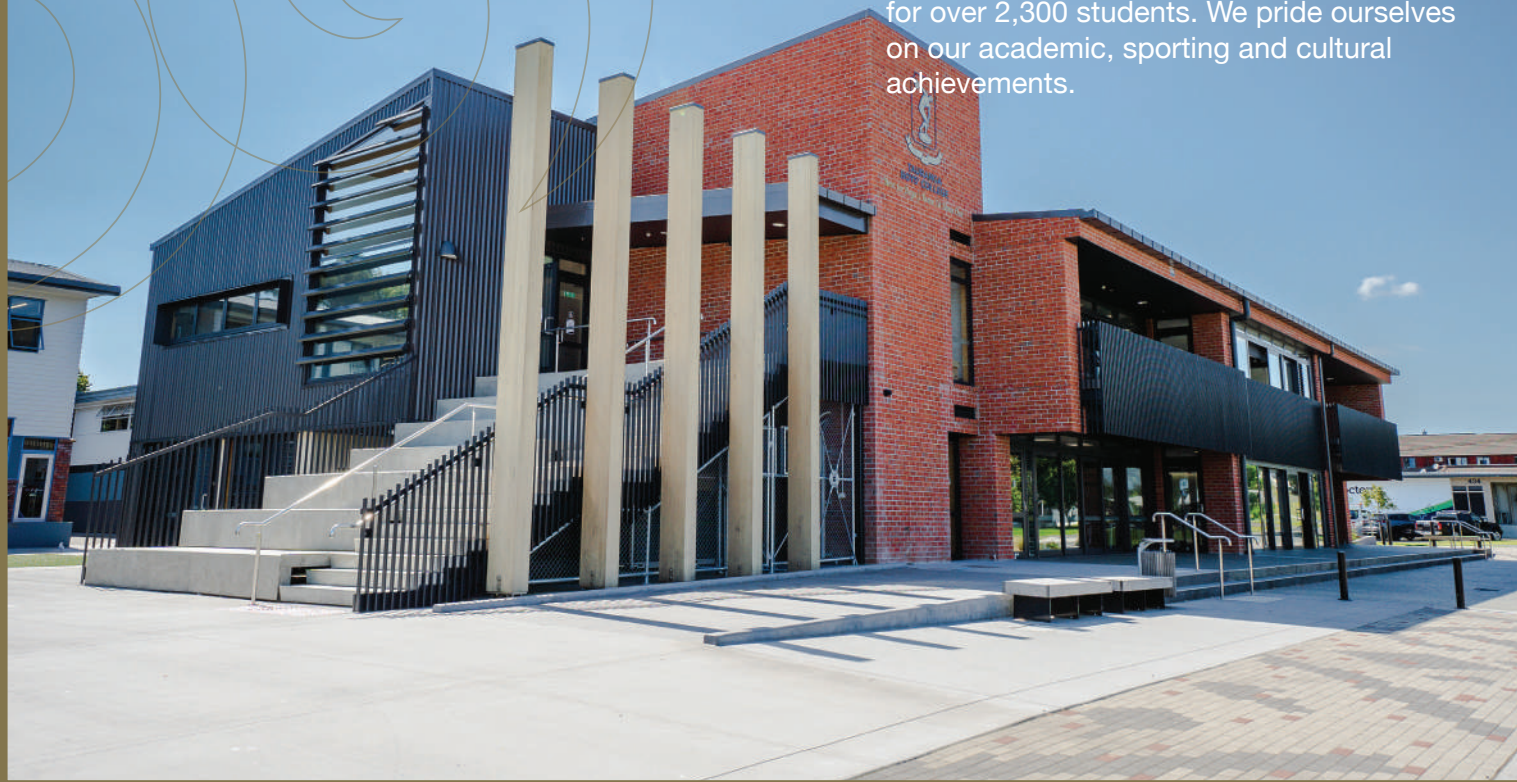
Homestay

All new students to Tauranga Boys' College are welcomed onto the college with a Haka Pōwhiri.



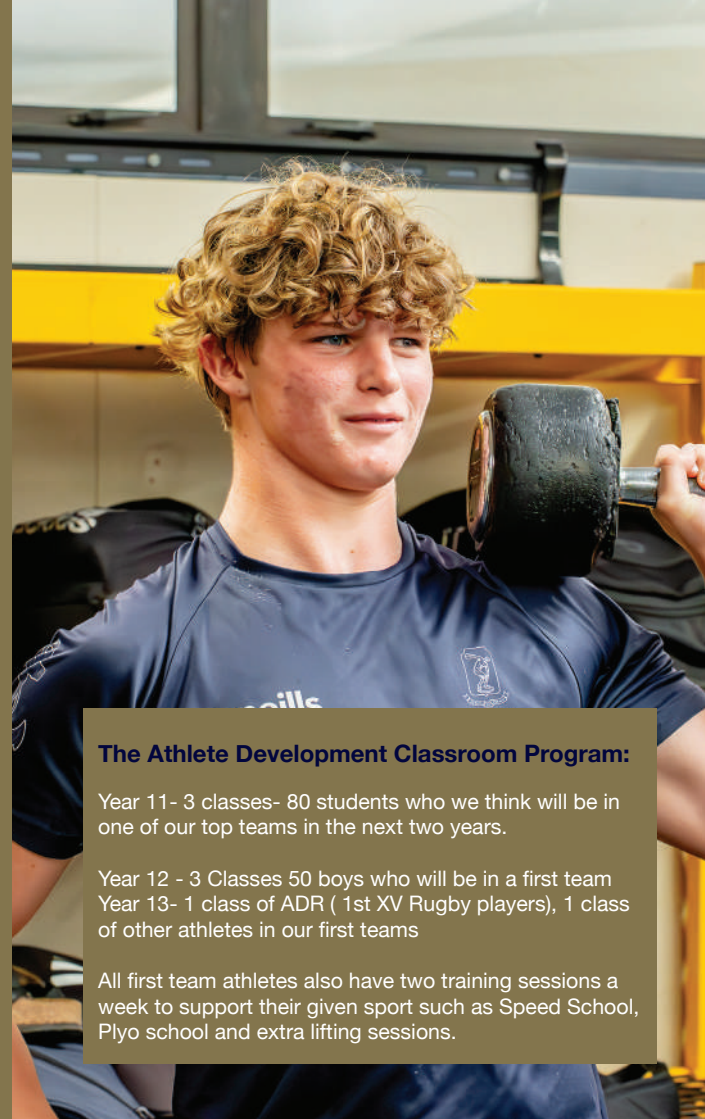
New Zealand's Leading *Athlete Development Programme*

Tauranga Boys' College secured nine national secondary school titles in 2024, consistently ranking among the top four schools in New Zealand. 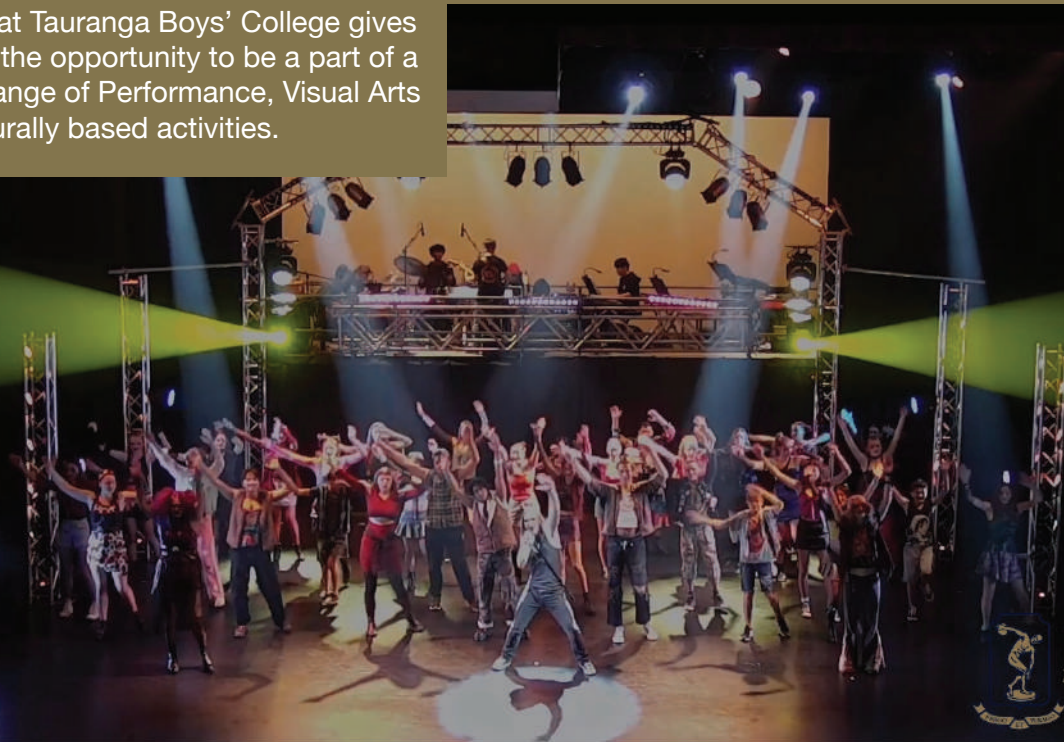

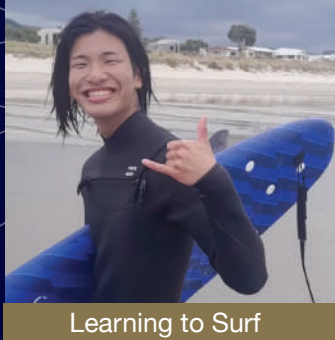

Year 13: NCEA Level 3

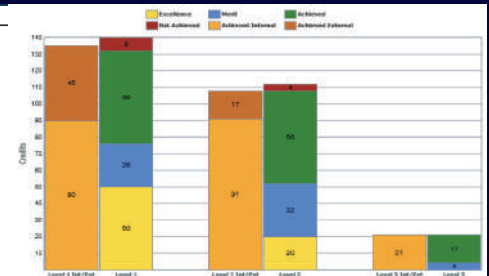
- Students in Year 13 will work towards University Entrance and their NCEA Level Three Qualification.
