



Music at Tauranga Boys' College

Music is a great way to engage your creative side – it uses the right side of the brain, helps develop motor skills, and most of all is loads of fun!

Music at Tauranga Boys' College is taught as a curriculum subject from Years 9 through to 13. Learning Music as a subject is a great way to engage your creative side, as well as develop your musicianship as a whole by learning both performing and composing, as well as theory and history.

There are many opportunities for the students to be involved outside of the classroom by taking part in some of our many co-curricular groups.

We rehearse both an advanced and beginner Jazz Big Band, Jazz Combos, a Barbershop Chorus and Quartets, Brass Quintet, Woodwind Ensemble, Guitar group and a Percussion Ensemble.



Group instrumental tuition is available at the college for a small one-off fee. Students have a 25-30 minute group lesson once a week, during the school day. Lesson timetables are rotated to minimise impact on curriculum lessons. Tuition is offered in the following instruments; vocals, guitar, bass guitar, drums, flute, clarinet, saxophone, trumpet, cornet, horn, trombone, tuba, violin, viola, cello, and double bass.
